



Who are we?

We are WCPI, the World CP Initiative. A worldwide collaboration of organizations involved in providing services to people with CP and their families.

The WCPI website - worldcpi.org – is a global hub for anyone looking for information about cerebral palsy. The website will be by and for the users – people with CP, or connected to CP through their work, research or family.

The site features links to organizations, research and more. The centrepiece is a Wiki section that will cover every aspect of life with CP, research and more.

What are we looking for?

Wikis are developed by people who have an interest, expertise or story to share, and are willing to put time and effort into writing and editing articles.

We are looking for **writers, moderators and editors** for the wiki section of the website. You may be a person with CP, a family member, someone who works for a CP organisation, a volunteer or a researcher.

Articles about what?

The articles can be about anything concerning CP. It can be an article on a specific topic – *e.g. health, wellbeing, education, fitness, employment, technology, access*. Or, it may be more specific, *e.g. What will my child be able to do?* If you have expertise or an opinion about a topic then you can write an article!

What do we ask from you?

As a writer you must be able to write clearly and informatively for a wide audience. Your writing has to be easily understandable. We're not trying to be a new medical journal!

Our moderators and editors will help to build the wiki community, provide impartial reviews of articles, add tags and categories to articles, and correct any inadvertent spelling or grammatical errors.

We hope that all our contributors will enjoy doing this of course!

We can help you and give you tips on how to best write an article and what types of things you need to do to create a reliable article. We'll provide you with a written guide or 'cheat sheet'.
